IMPORTANT HOMEWORK INFORMATION

READING

Please hear your child read every evening. Feel free to make any comments in the blue two-way book, and sign next to them. Please do not allow your child to read beyond the pages set by their teacher. All school books must be kept in your child's reading bag.

SPELLINGS

Year 1 – beginning in the spring term, new spellings are written in your child's spellings book every Tuesday. Please help your child to learn them, as they will be tested on the following Monday morning.

Year 2 and Year 3 – as above, but from the beginning of the autumn term.

Some high frequency words may also be included.

GENERAL HOMEWORK

Year 1 – beginning in the spring term, one piece of maths and one piece of English homework each Tuesday and Friday. Do not allow your child to work for longer than 10 minutes. The homework should be returned to school on the following Wednesday and Monday.

Year 2 – as year 1, but beginning in the autumn term, and do not allow your child to work for longer than 20 minutes.

Year 3 – as year 1, but beginning in the autumn term, and do not allow your child to work for longer than 30 minutes.

ASSESSMENTS

As part of the academic tracking which takes place at Hessle Mount it is essential that children attend school during term time. Time away from school for holidays is not encouraged. Year 2 and 3 children must attend school the week before the end of the first half Autumn Term for valuable internal assessments. Year 1 also take part in the academic tracking and their assessments will take place at the end of the Spring term.

Should you wish to speak to the teacher about any homework matter, please send a message in the blue two-way book. The teacher will get in touch with you as soon as possible, and we do read the blue books every day. As we begin the school day at 8.30 am, it is very disruptive to call the teacher from the classroom between 8.30 and 9.00 so please use the book as described.
